He joined other Middies players Jonny Manning (2020) and Anthony Stacey (1995) with this honor.

The 6-foot-5 wing player was a scoring machine his senior season, averaging more than 22 points per game. Gregory also controlled

the glass averaging more than eight

Liber earned the Lorain County Miss

Basketball award after finishing her senior season as the Eagles'alltime leading scorer, averaging 19 points per game. Only one other Avon player has received this honor, Emily Julius (2012).

She led the Eagles on the court with rebounds, assists, steals and points-scored, and Liber is brilliant off the court too. She finished high school with a 4.3 GPA before heading to St. Louis University to study and play Division I basketball.

In Lorain County the Burnett name is synonymous with wrestling. Former Pioneers coach Erik Burnett retired after the 2021-2022 season having spent decades with Elyria's program. His son Nate finished his high school career with a bang.

Nate Burnett ended his high school career sharing the Lorain County Wrestler of the Year title with teammate Peyton Fenton after battling through a late-season knee injury, grinding his way to a state semifinal appearance.

He graduated as a four-time state qualifier and a three-time state placer, now wrestling at Clarion University where his 2020 Clarion Sports Hall of Fame inductee father wrestled and earned a fifth-place finish at 118 pounds at the 1992 NCAA Championships.







Great expectations

As the Cleveland Cavaliers entered this season, expectations were high. The club was coming off a 44-win season in 2021-2022, which doubled the previous years' win total of 22.

The Cavs had advanced to the NBA play-in tournament, and while eliminated from the postseason after tough losses to Brooklyn and Atlanta, the blueprint had been established for success moving forward.

Jarrett Allen and Darius Garland were selected for the NBA All-Star game for the first time.

Evan Mobley was sterling in his first season, finishing as runner-up to Toronto's Scotty Barnes in the Rookie of the Year voting.

An award many said Mobley deserved to win.

Kevin Love was superb and flourished in his role coming off the bench.

The Cavs were an exciting, fun-to-watch team, led by a terrific coach in J.B. Bickerstaff, and the pieces were being assembled for a bright future at Rocket Mortgage Fieldhouse.


The time is now

That future suddenly became "now" shortly before Labor Day.

The Cavs stunned the league and accelerated their push for contention by acquiring Donovan Mitchell from the Utah Jazz in a blockbuster trade.

In a bold move by Koby Altman, president of basketball operations, the Cavs traded three players (Colin Sexton, Lauri Markenen and Ochai Obaji) as well as three first-round draft picks for the three-time All Star, and one of the game's elite players.

The acquisition of Mitchell transformed the lineup and fast-tracked the Cavs into an Eastern Conference contender. Suddenly, everyone throughout the NBA was talking about the Cavs, not in the future, but in present tense.



No disappointments

As the WEOL Winter Forecast goes to print, the Cavs have not disappointed.

Despite losing Garland for several games following an eye laceration suffered in an opening night loss to Toronto, the team ripped off an eight-game winning streak, including two overtime victories over the defending Eastern Conference champion Boston Celtics.

Mitchell has been as good (if not better) than advertised, racking up an average of over 30 points per game early in the season.

Allen has been outstanding after last season's absence caused by a finger injury down the stretch, which played a major role in the Cavs ending up in the play-in tournament rather than an opening round playoff series.

Mobley struggled early, after missing most of pre-season due to a sprained ankle, but appears back to his rookie year level of play. Mobley's potential is truly unlimited.

Garland has been dazzling upon his return, and once again Love's play off the bench has been tremendous.

Adding to the mix, there is Caris Levert, who has been solid in all aspects in the early part of the season. Levert was acquired from Indiana in February of last season, but never got into a flow with the Cavs after the trade.

Hampered by a foot injury and then being challenged to blend in with new teammates, his game struggled. But with an entire training camp and preseason to get acclimated (and fully healthy), Levert has been steady in the early season.

A 41-point outburst in the Cav's first victory over Boston showed off Levert's offensive firepower, where he managed a career-high average of six assists per game and relentless effort on the defensive end of the floor.

Levert has shown everyone that the Caris Levert the Cavs thought they were acquiring from the Pacers has arrived.

How good can this team be?

The answer to the question is, "very, very good."

The Cavs have all the ingredients to put together an outstanding season in the winloss column, with the only caveat being the ability (and luck) to stay injury-free.

Last year's win total of 44 would have been higher if not for the losses of Ricky Rubio, Levert and Allen for a significant number of games, and in Rubio's case, a season-ending knee injury suffered last December.

The starting five boasts three All-Star caliber players in Garland, Mitchell and Allen, a potential fourth All-Star in Mobley and then Levert. The bench is deep with Love, Dean Wade, Cedi Osman and Isaac Okoro providing quality minutes in their roles.

Aside from acquiring Mitchell, another shrewd move the Cavs made this offseason was bringing Rubio back, after he was sent to Indiana in the Levert trade.

Rubio's presence and on-court play last season was invaluable and the Cavs thrived when Rubio was on the floor. When Rubio returns, once he's fully recovered from his knee surgery, he will add even more depth and a veteran presence for Bickerstaff to turn to.

How far can they advance when the postseason rolls around?

So, with a lethal offensive backcourt that can pile up 50-60 points per game; sparkling play-making ability from Garland; quality "bigs" in Allen and Mobley, that provide not only an offensive punch but a tenacious duo defensively with rebounding and shot-blocking abilities; a tremendous bench; and with an emphasis on the defensive side of the ball from Bickerstaff, the Cavs have the makings of a 50-plus win season.

They should battle for one of the top four spots in the Eastern Conference. But, to repeat the earlier disclaimer, barring any major injuries.

How far can they go when the playoffs arrive in April?

The Cavs undoubtedly have the talent for a deep run in the Eastern Conference. What some of the key figures lack (mainly Garland, Mobley and Allen) is the experience of competing in the pressure cooker of post-season basketball.

In a typical playoff scenario, with two minutes to play in a two-point game, the weight of the moment is immense and until a player experiences it, there is uncertainty as to how they will respond.

That will be the case with the Cavs.

That said, one of the overlooked aspects of the Mitchell trade is the playoff experience he brings to the team. It's not just his star-level ability, Mitchell excelled in his postseason appearances with the Jazz, where every average (scoring, assists and rebounds) went up in the playoffs.

He rose to the moment in Western Conference post-season play.

Mitchell's understanding of "taking it to the next level," along with the playoff history of Love and Rubio, will be relied on while the younger core learns the lessons, intensity and challenges of playing beyond the regular season.

A top-four finish in the Eastern Conference would be a significant accomplishment for this team. It's also realistic.

If that occurs, the Cavs will avoid the play-in tournament, and secure home court advantage for a first-round best-of-seven playoff series.

After that, nothing will be easy against the likes of Boston, Milwaukee, Chicago, Miami, Atlanta, Philadelphia and Brooklyn, all are teams with that critical basketball playoff experience.

Anything the Cavs accomplish in the playoffs will have to be earned.

Altman and Cavs' General Manager Mike Gansey transformed the team into an Eastern Conference contender through astute drafting, skillful deal-making and the patience to allow the team to develop under Bickerstaff.

With the Mitchell trade, the pieces have been assembled and now the expectations are heightened.

It's time for this team to take the next step.

Let 'em know — and let's play some Cavaliers basketball!

If you're a Cavs' fan, 2022-2023 has the makings of what will surely be an exciting season to unfold in northeast Ohio.



Amherst will have an early test




Although Banyas did not end the season as she would have hoped, she was able to rally to finish in third place at the girls' state tournament, after three straight appearances during her high school career.


Girls getting their Schott

Banyas, a two-time 101-pound state runner-up, told Bennett, "I'd like to experience that but I don't believe that they're going to have us wrestling with the boys by the time my senior year rolls around." She continued, "But I'm really hoping that it does get to that point because I believe that we deserve as much spotlight as the boys. Our numbers have grown so much between my freshman year and now ... it's insane. So I don't know why we wouldn't get the same experience."

The first OHSAA girls' state wrestling tournament will be the same as the boys' with a three-day, five-session event held March 10-12 as a double-elimination tournament. The event averages more than 50,000 fans throughout the weekend.


